

RESIDENCE AFFIDAVIT

INSTRUCTIONS

With the exception of persons applying to M.B.A. Programs at locations other than Storrs, all applicants must complete and return this Residence Affidavit with the application for admission. Please do not detach this form.

A student's residence will be determined on the basis of the information supplied below. Changes in residence can be recognized only through proper application to the Residency Hearing Officer and by fulfilling the necessary statutory requirements for legal residence. Should a non-resident applicant become eligible for classification as an in-state student between the time of submitting this affidavit and the time of first enrollment, it will be necessary to submit an application for, or change of, classification in advance of the first week of classes in order to qualify for in-state tuition rates for that semester.

DEFINITION OF TERMS

1. An "emancipated person" means a person who has attained the age of eighteen years and whose parents have entirely surrendered the right to the care, custody, and earnings of such person and who no longer are under any legal obligation to support or maintain such person.

NOTE: This means that an emancipated person cannot be claimed as a deduction for federal or state income tax purposes by any parent or guardian. Also, in order to be considered an emancipated person, an individual cannot obtain monies or other financial aid which is given based upon the parent's or guardian's financial statement.

2. The term "domicile" denotes a person's true, fixed, and permanent home and place of habitation. It is the place where the person intends to remain, and to which he or she expects to return when leaving for purposes other than that of establishing a new domicile elsewhere.

GUIDELINES FOR DETERMINING RESIDENCE

1. A person seeking classification as an in-state student, if emancipated from parents, must be able to show proof of domicile within the State of Connecticut for a period of not less than 1 year prior to the first day of classes of the semester in question.
2. An unemancipated person's residence is considered to be that of the parent or guardian.
3. The spouse of any person who is classified, or is eligible for classification, as an in-state student shall likewise be classified as an in-state student.
4. A person who is a member of the Armed Services and is stationed in Connecticut pursuant to military orders, as well as the spouse, may qualify for in-state status for tuition purposes by fulfilling the necessary statutory requirements for legal residence. Unemancipated children may qualify at once for in-state tuition payment. Attach a copy of military orders which clearly indicate a Connecticut duty-station.
5. Non-Citizens studying at the University cannot become residents for purposes of tuition payment unless granted a Permanent Resident Visa by the United States Government. A student granted such a visa may make application for classification as an in-state student when he or she has satisfied the necessary statutory requirements for legal residence, and has presented the alien registration card in person.
